2023 Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey: A reminder that our school is conducting a survey to find out what parents/caregivers/guardians think of our school. The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage all families, who have been randomly selected, to participate. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies. A random sample of approximately 30 per cent of parents/caregivers/guardians has been selected to participate in this year's survey. The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be open until Friday 8 September 2023. Parents/Caregivers/Guardians who have been randomly selected will be sent out a survey link. The survey will be conducted online, only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the survey period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese.

Student Attendance: At Oberon, we are continually working on supporting our students to attend school as much as possible. This has so many benefits for our students and we also get to see more of their smiling faces when they walk past our new signs! Please read the information below that again reiterates the importance of attending Oberon Primary School.

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. Missing school can have a major impact on a child's future – a student missing one day a fortnight will miss four full weeks by the end of the year.

By Year 10 they'll have missed more than a year of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes. Coming to school every day, for the whole day, is vital. If your child must miss school, speak with your classroom teacher as early as possible. Parents can be fined for not sending students to school without an acceptable reason. If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day. We understand that on the odd occasion, your child may be late for school or need to leave earlier than 3.15 pm. Please collect either a late arrival pass or an early departure card for these instances.








The Grade 1/2 students read the Empty Pot this week and reflected on how they can be fair and trustworthy students at Oberon PS.
